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

National Assessment Program

Literacy and Numeracy

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) Assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school effectively. Students in Years 3,5,7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests during May. In 2018, for the first time in Australia, a small percentage of students will sit NAPLAN online. Our students will, however, complete this year's assessments in their paper booklets.


